BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL (KINGS HEATH LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOOD) (PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES) ORDER 2022

Birmingham City Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:

Commencement and citation

1.1 This Order shall come into operation on the 22nd of April Two Thousand and Twenty Two and may be cited as "Birmingham City Council (Kings Heath Low Traffic Neighbourhood) (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 2022".

2. Interpretation

- 2.1 In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:
- "Authorised Person" means an employee or agent of the Council authorised to exercise all or any of the functions of the Council under this Order;
- "Carriageway(s)" has the same meaning as in Section 329 (1) of the Highways Act 1980 (as amended);
- "Footway(s)" has the same meaning as in Section 329 (1) of the Highways Act 1980 (as amended);
- "Goods" means goods or burden of any kind and includes postal packets of any description; and delivering and collecting in relation to any Goods include checking the Goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;
- "Highway" means all Carriageways, Footways and Verges;
- "Road" means any length of Highway or any other road to which the public has access, and includes bridges over which a road passes as set out in Section 142(1) of the Act;
- "Universal Service Provider" has the same meaning as in Section 4 (3) and (4) of the Postal Services Act 2000;
- "Verge" means any land forming part of a Road that is not a Carriageway or a Footway.
- 2.2 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by

any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

- 2.3 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.
- 2.4 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2.5 Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibition of motor vehicles

- 3.1 Save as provided in Article 3.2, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any motor vehicle to enter or proceed in the length of Road referred to in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 3.2 The provisions of Article 3.1 do not apply to any motor vehicle being used in connection with any of the following operations, namely;
 - (a) police, fire brigade or ambulance duties;
 - (b) building, demolition operations or essential maintenance;
 - (c) the maintenance, improvement, cleansing or reconstruction of the said lengths of road;
 - (d) the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - the service of a local authority, the Environment Agency, a water undertaker or a sewerage undertaker or their agents in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (f) a public procession, festival or similar event provided that the prior written consent of the highway authority has been obtained to the said lengths of road being included in the route to be followed;
 - (g) a security vehicle being used for the delivery of money or valuables to or collection of money or valuables from premises fronting the said lengths of road;

(h) for the purpose of delivering or collecting Goods by a Universal Service Provider.

SCHEDULE 2 (ARTICLE 3.1)

STATION ROAD	at a point approximately 65 metres in a westerly direction from its junction with High Street
GRANGE ROAD	at a point approximately 8 metres in an easterly direction from the centreline of its junction with York Road
SILVER STREET	at a point approximately 15 metres in an easterly direction from the centreline of its junction with Whitesmith Croft
HIGHBURY ROAD	at a point approximately 3 metres in a south easterly direction from its junction with Grange Road
POPLAR ROAD	at a point approximately 40 metres in a south easterly direction from the centreline of its junction with Woodville Road
COLMORE ROAD	at a point approximately 30 metres in a northerly direction from its junction with Howard Road
HAZLEHURST ROAD	at a point approximately 35 metres in a northerly direction from its junction with Howard Road
ALL SAINTS ROAD	at a point approximately 18 metres in a northerly direction of its junction with Howard Road
