

Lindsworth School

**Proposal to:
Remove the Boarding
Provision**

March 2026

Introduction

Birmingham City Council (the Council), as the Local Authority for Birmingham, is consulting on a proposal to make changes to Lindsworth School (the School), which is a Council maintained special school.

The School is commissioned for 160 places for pupils between Year 4 and Year 11 with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) for Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs.

The school has boarding provision on the school site.

What changes are proposed?

We are proposing to carry out the following change to Lindsworth School:

- Remove boarding provision
- With effect from 1st April 2027

Why do we want to do this?

Background:

- The School has not admitted pupils with an EHCP for a boarding place for several years.
- There are currently no pupils on roll at Lindsworth that require boarding provision as part of their EHCP.
- Currently the residential accommodation on site is not used for overnight provision.
- BCC is continuing to fund the unfilled boarding places from the High Needs Funding Block, which equates to £450,120 for the year 2025 / 26.

If the boarding provision is removed:

- The associated High Needs funding can be reallocated.
- The residential accommodation can be repurposed to enhance the education of the wider school population.
- The potential financial implications of this change will be considered via a working group to support the School in managing any negative impact on its budget.

Should the proposal proceed:

- A financial analysis of the School's expenditure on the residential provision (including staffing and all other expenses) will be carried out.

When will these changes happen?

If the proposal is approved by the decision maker (following full consultation) it is intended that the proposal to remove the boarding provision will be implemented on 1st April 2027.

How will this affect pupils at the school?

There are no pupils on roll at the School with boarding provision as part of their EHCP. The current residential accommodation has been utilised by pupils for extra-curricular, extended day activities and support (these pupils do not have boarding provision as part of their EHCP). These activities extend up to 7:30pm between Monday and Thursday each week. The facility will remain available for use by the School to support its pupils as appropriate.

Evidence of demand

There have been no pupils requiring boarding provision as part of their EHCPs on roll at the School for several years and there is no evidence of current demand for boarding provision at the School.

Birmingham's SEND Sufficiency Strategy for 2024–2030 does not include any requirement for residential provision in maintained or academy special schools.

How will this affect staff?

The School employs several staff associated with the residential provision. Both the Council and the School recognise the potential workforce implications. If the proposal to close the residential provision is approved, those staff affected, along with relevant trade unions and professional associations, will be fully consulted at the earliest opportunity, and options will be explored to minimise adverse impact, including redeployment opportunities and use of natural turnover where possible. Any changes will be managed in accordance with employment law and HR policies.

Will there be changes to the school building?

There are no direct changes to the buildings required to remove boarding provision from the education offered by the School. If the boarding provision is removed, it is intended that the current residential spaces will be repurposed to enhance provision for the wider school population, subject to any relevant approvals.

What are the project costs for this proposal and how is it funded?

There are no anticipated project costs for removing the boarding provision that will need to be financed by the School. Any repurposing of the residential facility spaces would be supported by the Council, with any additional and relevant approvals.

Will this definitely happen?

No, there is a statutory process we must follow to make these sorts of changes to schools. This document is the first stage of the statutory consultation process, referred to as the 'Pre-publication period'. Any comments received at this stage will be considered by the Council, in consultation with the school, and a decision will be made to proceed to the next statutory stage known as the 'Representation Period'. There will be a further opportunity to comment during the next stage of this process.

Following completion of the 'Representation Period', all comments received will be forwarded to the decision maker for consideration. Within two months of the end of the 'Representation Period', the Council's Cabinet Member for Children, Young People and Families will be required to make a decision. It is only at that point that we will be able to say whether the boarding provision will be removed.

What will happen if this proposal is rejected?

If this proposal is rejected, Lindsworth School will remain a special school with a designation for boarding provision. The School will still have to maintain and resource the residential spaces, and the Council will continue to allocate High Needs funding to the School.

How can I make my views known?

We invite all interested parties to give us their comments on this proposal.
