# THE BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL (SHELDON COUNTRY PARK) (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACE) ORDER 202\*

The Birmingham City Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 32, 33, 34, 35, 35B, 35C, 101 and 102 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order.

#### PART I

#### **GENERAL**

#### Commencement and citation

- 1.1 This Order shall come into operation on \*th of \* two thousand and \* and may be cited as the "Birmingham City Council (Sheldon Country Park) (Off-Street Parking Place) Order 202\*".
- 1.2 The Parking Place Order Plan titled "Birmingham City Council (Sheldon Country Park) (Off-Street Parking Place) Order 202\*" (referenced 80596 L02 V2 attached hereto) is incorporated into this Order.

#### Interpretation

- 2. (a) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:
  - "Authorised Officer" means an employee or agent of the Council authorised to exercise all or any of the functions of the Council under this Order;
  - "Badges Regulations" means the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 or equivalent regulations having effect in Scotland, Northern Ireland or Wales:
  - "Business" means a business that operates from property located within the Parking Place Order Boundary;
  - "Business Employees" means staff employed by a Business;
  - "Charging Hours" means any period specified in column 2 of Part I of Schedule 1 to this Order:
  - "Disabled Person's Vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act;
  - "Disabled Person's Badge" means a badge which:-
    - (a) was issued, or has effect as if issued, to a disabled person or an institution under the Badges Regulations; and
    - (b) has not ceased to be valid;

- "Driver" means the person driving or having control or charge of the vehicle at any given time and in particular, in relation to a vehicle waiting, the person driving at the time it was left:
- "Electric Vehicle" means a vehicle in which the electrical motive power is derived from an electrical storage battery which is not connected to any source of power when the vehicle is in motion;
- "Invalid Carriage" has the same meaning as defined in Section 136 of the Act;
- "Motor Car" has the same meaning as defined in Section 136 of the Act;
- "Motor Cycle" has the same meaning as defined in Section 136 of the Act;
- "Motor Vehicle" has the same meaning as defined in Section 136 of the Act;
- "Owner" has the same meaning as defined in sub-section (1) of Section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;
- "Parking Bay" means any area of the Parking Place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and indicated by markings or delineation on the surface of the Parking Place;
- "Parking Charge(s)" means the charges specified in the Schedule 1 Part II set by the Council in relation to the Parking Place that is required to be paid by the Driver of the vehicle when the vehicle is left in the Parking Place during the Charging Hours;
- "Parking Payment Device" means any telephone or internet enabled device;
- "Parking Place" means any area of land within the Parking Place Order Boundary;
- "Parking Place Order Boundary" means the boundary identified as such on the Parking Place Order Plan;
- "Parking Place Order Plan" means the plan titled "Birmingham City Council (Sheldon Country Park) (Off-Street Parking Place) Order 202\*" and referenced 80596 L02 (attached hereto) as incorporated into this Order;
- "Pay And Display Ticket" means a Pay And Display Ticket issued by a Payment Machine located in the Parking Place in which the vehicle has been parked on payment of a Parking Charge and in accordance with the provisions of this Order;
- "Payment Machine" means apparatus designed to indicate the time by a clock and to record or indicate the payment of the Parking Charge, the period in respect of which it has been paid, the date and time at which the Parking Charge was paid, the vehicle registration where required and where available issue a Pay And Display Ticket indicating this information;
- "Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued and fixed to a vehicle by or on behalf of the Council in relation to a contravention of one of the provisions of this Order;
- "Period Parking Card" means a device or card issued at the discretion of the Council that will allow parking for a period determined by the Council at the time the Period Parking Card is issued:
- "Permit" means a permit issued by the Council for the purpose of parking a specified vehicle in a Parking Bay or area designated for use by Permit Holders and used in accordance with the Council's terms and conditions:

"Permit Holder" means a person to whom a Permit or Virtual Permit has been issued under the provisions of this Order;

"Police Vehicle" means a vehicle being used in pursuance of police duties;

"Recharging Post" means a device designed for the recharging of Electric Vehicles;

"Recharging Supplier" means a company appointed by the Council to provide Recharging Posts and other infrastructure for the recharging of Electric Vehicles;

#### "Relevant Position" means:

- (a) for the display of a Permit, Season Ticket, Period Parking Card or Pay And Display Ticket, that the Permit, Season Ticket, Period Parking Card or Pay And Display Ticket is displayed either inside the front windscreen of the vehicle, where the vehicle is fitted with a front windscreen, or in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that all the information recorded on the front of the Permit, Season Ticket, Period Parking Card or Pay And Display Ticket is legible and clearly visible to a person standing at the front or nearside of the vehicle and the Permit, Season Ticket, Period Parking Card or Pay And Display Ticket shall be displayed for the whole time that the vehicle remains in the Parking Place:
- (b) for the display of a Disabled Person's Badge or Parking Disc, that the Disabled Person's Badge or Parking Disc is displayed as stated in Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000, and shall be displayed for the whole time that the vehicle remains in the Parking Place;

"Resident" means a person whose principal residential address is located within the Parking Place Order Boundary;

"Resident Permit" means a permit issued by the Council to a Resident for the purpose of parking a specified vehicle in a Parking Bay designated for use by Resident Permit Holders and used in accordance with the Council's terms and conditions:

"Resident Permit Holder" means a person to whom a Resident Permit or Virtual Resident Permit has been issued under the provisions of this Order;

"Season Ticket" means a ticket issued at the discretion of the Council that will allow parking for a period of months such period being determined by the Council at the time the Season Ticket is issued and used in accordance with the Council's terms and conditions:

"Season Ticket Holder" means a person to whom a Season Ticket or Virtual Season Ticket has been issued under the provisions of this Order;

"Service Charge(s)" means a charge which may be payable to the Service Provider in addition to the Parking Charge payable in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 for vehicles using the Telephone Payment Parking System;

"Service Provider" means the company authorised and appointed by the Council to operate, administer and maintain the process for the payment of Parking Charges using the Telephone Payment Parking System;

"Telephone Payment Parking System" means a system to facilitate and monitor the payment of Parking Charges, together with the Service Charge, using any Parking Payment Device via communication with the Service Provider, in accordance with the Service Provider's terms and conditions and in accordance with instructions indicated on signs located at each Parking Place where the system is operational;

"Virtual Permit" means a permit which is issued by the Council to the Permit Holder electronically as an alternative to a paper Permit and used in accordance with the Council's terms and conditions:

"Virtual Resident Permit" means a permit which is issued by the Council to the Resident electronically as an alternative to a paper Resident Permit and used in accordance with the Council's terms and conditions;

"Virtual Season Ticket" means a season ticket which is issued by the Council to the Season Ticket Holder electronically as an alternative to a paper Season Ticket and used in accordance with the Council's terms and conditions;

- (b) Parts I, II, IV and V of this Order and Sections A and B of Part I of Schedule 1 to this Order shall apply at all times but Part III of this Order and Parts II and III of Schedule 1 to this Order shall only apply during the Charging Hours.
- (c) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.

#### PART II

#### **USE OF PARKING PLACES**

- 3. (a) The Parking Place may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of vehicles, in such positions on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to the Parking Place in Schedule 1.
  - (b) Where in Part I of Schedule 1 the Parking Place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class and such vehicles are permitted to wait in a specified position, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in that Parking Place unless it is of the class and in the position so specified.
  - (c) (i) Where, within the Parking Place, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a Parking Bay is available only for a Disabled Person's Vehicle, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking Bay unless it is a Disabled Person's Vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in the Relevant Position.
    - (ii) Where, within the Parking Place, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a Parking Bay is available only for Motor Cycles, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in that Parking Bay unless it is a Motor Cycle having two wheels and not having a sidecar attached.
    - (iii) Where, within the Parking Place, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a Parking Bay or designated area is available only for the holders of a Permit, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in that Parking Bay or designated area unless:
      - (a) the vehicle is displaying the relevant Permit for that Parking Bay or designated area in the Relevant Position; or
      - (b) a Virtual Permit has been issued to the Permit Holder for the leaving of that vehicle in that Parking Bay or designated area.
    - (iv) Where, within the Parking Place, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a Parking Bay or designated area is available only for the holders of a Resident Permit,

the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in that Parking Bay or designated area unless:

- (a) the vehicle is displaying the relevant Resident Permit for that Parking Bay or designated area in the Relevant Position; or
- (b) a Virtual Resident Permit has been issued to the Resident Permit Holder for the leaving of that vehicle in that Parking Bay or designated area.
- (v) Where, within the Parking Place, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a Parking Bay is available only for an Electric Vehicle, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking Bay:
  - (a) unless it is an Electric Vehicle left during the process of actively recharging with electricity via the recharging lead while connected to the Recharging Post relating to that Parking Bay; and
  - (b) for a continuous period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified for that Parking Bay; and
  - (c) if a period of less than the no return interval specified for that Parking Bay has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the Electric Vehicle in that Parking Bay.

Any payment for the use of electricity whilst parked in such a Parking Bay shall be paid to the Electric Vehicle Recharging Supplier in accordance with their terms and conditions of use as notified on the Recharging Post nearby.

- (vi) Where, within the Parking Place, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a Parking Bay is available only for a Police Vehicle, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking Bay unless it is a Police Vehicle.
- (vii) Where, within the Parking Place, there is an area with yellow lines or signed as 'no waiting', the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait on that area.
- (viii) Where, within the Parking Place, there is a restricted area marked with a yellow hatched surface marking, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait on that area.
- (ix) Where in the Parking Place it is indicated by notice for the time being erected by the Council that parking is not permitted in the whole or part of the Parking Place between specified times on specified dates, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in the Parking Place or part of the Parking Place between the specified times on the specified dates.
- (d) In so far as a vehicle is left in the Parking Place during the Charging Hours the Driver thereof shall pay such Parking Charges as are specified in the following provisions of this Order.
- (e) (i) An Authorised Officer may suspend the use of the Parking Place or any part thereof for all or specified users whenever it is considered that such suspension is reasonably necessary.
  - (ii) Any person suspending the use of any Parking Place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 3(e)(i) shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the Parking Place or part thereof the use of which is suspended a sign indicating that waiting by vehicles or specified vehicles is prohibited.
  - (iii) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle or specified vehicle to be left in any part of the Parking Place during such period as there is in or adjacent to that part of the Parking Place a sign placed in pursuance of Article 3(e)(ii).

## PART III

# CHARGES, PAYMENT AND DISPLAY OF PERMIT, PAY AND DISPLAY TICKET OR SEASON TICKET

- 4. The charges for the parking of vehicles during the Charging Hours in the Parking Place shall be as set out in Part II of Schedule 1 to this Order PROVIDED THAT where in the Parking Place it is indicated by notice for the time being erected by the Council that a charge lower than the scale of Parking Charges in Part II shall be payable, or that no charge shall be payable, then that lower charge shall be payable, or no charge shall be payable, as the case may be.
- 5. The following vehicles left in the Parking Place shall be exempt from the payment of any charge specified in Part II of Schedule 1 to this Order:-
  - (a) An Invalid Carriage;
  - (b) A vehicle being used by a disabled person to whom a Disabled Person's Badge has been issued under the Badges Regulations PROVIDED THAT the Disabled Person's Badge is displayed in the Relevant Position;
  - (c) vehicles being used for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes.
- 6. A Police Vehicle shall be exempt from the payment of any charge when parked in a Parking Bay that has a sign or surface marking which indicates that the Parking Bay is available only for a Police Vehicle.
- 7. (a) The Owner of a vehicle may on application to the Council purchase a Season Ticket or Period Parking Card for the charge specified in Part III or Section B of Part II of Schedule 1 respectively and that Season Ticket or Period Parking Card shall be valid for the Parking Place during the period for which it is issued.
  - (b) The holder of a Season Ticket or Period Parking Card may surrender a Season Ticket or Period Parking Card to the Council in accordance with the terms of its issue and shall return a Season Ticket or Period Parking Card to the Council in accordance with paragraphs (c), (d) and (e) of this Article.
  - (c) The Council may, by notice in writing served on the holder of a Season Ticket or Period Parking Card to the address stated on the holder's application for the Season Ticket or Period Parking Card or to that person's last known place of abode, cancel a Season Ticket or Period Parking Card if it appears to the Council that the Season Ticket or Period Parking Card has ceased to be valid pursuant to paragraph (e) of this Article or that the conditions subject to which the Season Ticket or Period Parking Card has been issued have not been observed in accordance with this Article, and the holder of the Season Ticket or Period Parking Card to the Council within 48 hours of the date of receipt of the notice.
  - (d) Where a Season Ticket or Period Parking Card is issued to a person and the payment is subsequently dishonoured, the Season Ticket or Period Parking Card shall immediately cease to be valid and the Council shall by notice served on the person to whom such Season Ticket or Period Parking Card was issued to the email or postal address stated on the holder's application for the Season Ticket or Period Parking Card or to that person's last known place of abode, require that person to return the Season Ticket or Period Parking Card to the Council within 48 hours of the date of receipt of the notice.
  - (e) Without prejudice to the foregoing paragraphs of this Article, a Season Ticket or Period Parking Card shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified on the front of the Season Ticket or Period Parking Card.

- 8. (a) (i) Where a Driver parks a vehicle in the Parking Place during the Charging Hours and does not display, in respect of that vehicle, a valid Season Ticket, Period Parking Card, Permit, Resident Permit, or is not the holder of a Virtual Season Ticket, Virtual Resident Permit or Virtual Permit that is valid for the time of parking, the Driver shall pay in respect of that vehicle a Parking Charge as laid down in Part II of Schedule 1 on the leaving of the vehicle in the Parking Place, without delay, by:-
  - (a) the payment of the Parking Charge and the relevant additional charges set out in Part II of Schedule 1, by Parking Payment Device in accordance with any instructions set out on notices nearby in the Parking Place; or
  - (b) where available, the insertion into the Payment Machine of an appropriate coin or coins where more than one coin is required, they shall be inserted into the Payment Machine immediately one after the other; or where available with payment by credit card, debit card or Parking Payment Device via the Payment Machine.
  - (ii) Where a Driver in seeking to pay a Parking Charge inserts into a Payment Machine a coin or coins which exceeds the charge for a specified number of hours, a Pay And Display Ticket will be issued only for the number of hours, for which the whole of the charge has been paid.
  - (iii) Where required to do so by instructions on the Telephone Payment Parking System or displayed on the Payment Machine, the Driver seeking to pay the Parking Charge shall enter the vehicle registration mark of the vehicle that is to be left within the Parking Place.
  - (b) Any Pay And Display Ticket issued on the payment of the Parking Charge referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article shall be displayed in a Relevant Position.
  - (c) Where a Driver parks a vehicle in the Parking Place and is the holder in respect of that vehicle of a valid Permit, Resident Permit, Season Ticket or Period Parking Card issued by the Council, the Driver shall display that Permit, Resident Permit, Season Ticket or Period Parking Card in a Relevant Position.
  - (d) Where a Virtual Permit, Virtual Resident Permit or Virtual Season Ticket has been issued by the Council, to a Permit Holder, Resident Permit Holder or Season Ticket Holder in respect of a vehicle in the Parking Place, the Permit Holder, Resident Permit Holder or Season Ticket Holder shall be exempt from the requirement in subsection (c) above to display a Permit, Resident Permit or Season Ticket.
  - (e) (i) Payment of the Parking Charge in accordance with Article 8(a)(i)(a) for a vehicle left during the Charging Hours in the Parking Place can be confirmed by the Driver via the Parking Payment Device indicating that the payment has been accepted and confirming the time at which the period for which payment has been made by the Parking Charge will expire.
    - (ii) The expiry of the period for which the Parking Charge has been paid in accordance with Article 8(a)(i)(a) shall be indicated in the electronic record of the Parking Charge payments accepted.
- 9. (a) A vehicle must not be left in the Parking Place during the Charging Hours for longer than the period for which payment has been made of the Parking Charge.
  - (b) Except with the written authority of the Council, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the Parking Place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in Part I of Schedule 1 in relation to that Parking Place and any vehicle found waiting in such a manner shall be treated as a vehicle parked without displaying a valid Pay And Display Ticket for each and every day thereafter.

- 10. Where a Penalty Charge Notice has been attached to a vehicle, no person other than the Driver of the vehicle or an Authorised Officer, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised by the Driver.
- 11. When any Pay And Display Ticket, Permit, Resident Permit, Season Ticket or Period Parking Card has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with Article 8 no person, other than the Driver of the vehicle, shall remove such Pay And Display Ticket, Permit, Resident Permit, Season Ticket or Period Parking Card from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the Driver.
- 12. (a) Where a Payment Machine at the Parking Place fails to issue a Pay And Display Ticket, the Driver of any vehicle using any such Parking Place shall pay the Parking Charge at an alternative Payment Machine within the Parking Place.
  - (b) Where a Driver attempts to pay the Parking Charge in accordance with Article 8(a)(i)(b) but is unable to do so, the Driver shall pay the Parking Charge in accordance with Article 8(a)(i)(a).
- 13. If in accordance with Article 8(a)(i) payment of the Parking Charge is required but no method of paying the Parking Charge is available the Driver shall remove that vehicle from the Parking Place without delay.

#### PART IV

#### **OTHER PROVISIONS**

- 14. The Driver of a motor vehicle using the Parking Place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in the location it is to be parked in the Parking Place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in the Parking Place or to depart from the Parking Place.
- 15. Unless authorised in writing by the Council no person shall use a vehicle or anything towed by a vehicle when it is within the Parking Place, to offer for sale any goods or other article including a vehicle to persons in or near the Parking Place or offer for sale or hire his or her skill or services or for the purpose of any exhibition, or for plying for hire. No notices or advertising material of any description shall be placed by any person on vehicles parked within the Parking Place except as authorised by the Council.
- 16. Unless authorised in writing by the Council, no person shall use any part of the Parking Place or any vehicle left in the Parking Place:—
  - (a) for sleeping, BBQs or cooking; or
  - (b) for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the Parking Place.
- 17. The Driver of any vehicle in the Parking Place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in the Parking Place or to depart from the Parking Place.
- 18. The Driver of any vehicle in the Parking Place shall comply with any instructions given, whether orally by an Authorised Officer, by direction signs whether erected or by surface markings or in any other manner as to the route to be followed within the Parking Place.
- 19. A Driver shall not park a vehicle on any space indicated by appropriate markings as being reserved for official use.

### PART V

### ENFORCEMENT, REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF VEHICLES FROM A PARKING PLACE

- 20. When a vehicle is left in the Parking Place in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the Owner will become liable for a penalty charge and an Authorised Person may affix a Penalty Charge Notice to the vehicle.
- 21. Where a Penalty Charge Notice has been issued, the penalty charge shall be paid to the Council in accordance with the instructions on the Penalty Charge Notice.
- 22. If a vehicle is left in the Parking Place other than in accordance with the Article 3 or is deemed by the Council to be causing an obstruction, an Authorised Officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that it complies with Article 3 or no longer causes an obstruction.
- 23. When a vehicle is left in the Parking Place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in this Order or is deem by the Council to be causing an obstruction, an Authorised Officer or any person acting on the instructions of such an officer, may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that Parking Place and shall provide for its safe custody.
- 24. In an emergency, an Authorised Officer or a police constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in the Parking Place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from the Parking Place.
- 25. Any person altering, or causing the alteration of, the position of a vehicle by virtue of Article 22 or 24, or removing, or causing the removal of, a vehicle by virtue of Articles 23 or 24 of this Order, may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as they may think reasonably necessary to enable the position of the vehicle to be altered or the vehicle to be removed.
- 26. Any person removing or arranging for the removal of a vehicle by virtue of Articles 23 or 24 shall make such arrangements as they consider to be reasonably necessary for the safety of the vehicle in the place to which it is removed.
- 27. Any expenses incurred by the Council in removing a vehicle by virtue of Articles 23 or in making arrangements for the safe custody of the vehicle by virtue of Article 24 shall be recoverable by the Council from the Owner of the vehicle.
- The Council may as respects a vehicle which has been removed from the Parking Place in pursuance of Article 23, if it appears to have been abandoned, sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle after having made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the Owner of the vehicle in accordance with the procedure set out in the Refuse Disposal (Amenity) Act 1978 (as amended).
- 29. Where the Driver of a vehicle is alleged by the Council to have failed to comply with this Order, the Owner of the vehicle and any other person shall if requested by an Authorised Officer give such information as they are able as to the identity and whereabouts of the Driver.

### SCHEDULE 1 PART I

#### A. POSITION IN WHICH VEHICLE MAY WAIT

Parking Place - provided that the vehicle is not in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order

### B. <u>CLASSES OF VEHICLES FOR WHICH PARKING PLACE IS AVAILABLE</u>

Motor Cycles, Motor Cars, Invalid Carriages and Motor Vehicles constructed or adapted solely for the purpose of carrying goods, but not exceeding 3,500 kilograms unladen weight.
