Revision to Option 4

We have carefully considered feedback from the final phase of libraries consultation and found it very valuable. It highlighted the need for more equitable hours across the city, and in response, we are now proposing a revision of Option 4.

This proposal is directly based on input during the **final phase** of consultation and will be the recommendation to cabinet.

We now want to hear views on the revised Option 4 and the proposed hours for each Library. This will be incorporated into the final report.

Revised option 4 (recommended) proposal

Following the analysis of feedback from the final phase of the Libraries Consultation, Option 4 has been revised. Key changes are as follows:

- Hub location for Ladywood
 - Feedback from the final in-person consultations shared that Library of Birmingham did not represent a Library Community Hub. **Small Heath Library** is now the proposed Library Community Hub for Ladywood.
- Hours per Library for Hubs and Part-time Libraries
 - Feedback from the final consultation was that the disparity of 5-day and 2-day opening was too great and did not offer high footfall Libraries enough provision.
 - Hours have been redistributed on a **4-day (Hub), 3-day and 2-day basis**.
 - As with all Libraries there will be an opportunity for full time opening, supported by internal and external partners, groups and the community.

High-level overview of the revised proposed offer (Option 4*)

BCC is committed to ensuring library services are provided in the designated Ward. However, this may not involve the existing library building. The decision will depend on the condition of the building, and efforts will be made to explore co-location options or alternative locations.

All current building- based provision to remain open, with savings delivered through reduced staff hours in some Libraries and the introduction of partner-led provision.
