Birmingham Cycle Revolution: Local Links Package 3 – Cuckoo Road

Birmingham Cycle Revolution is an exciting initiative to encourage more people to cycle in and around the city. Our vision is to make cycling an everyday way to travel in Birmingham. We want 5% of all trips in the city to be made by bike by 2023 and to double this again to 10% by 2033. This will help to make our city healthier, greener, safer and less congested.

Cuckoo Road is included in the Local Link schemes which represent on-highway works to facilitate cycle movement to and from the off-road Green Routes (particularly where these cross public roads) and to link them to the main on-street cycling network.

The proposals for Road include:

- Installation of a wheel ramp on the existing steps at the entry/exit to Grand Union Canal towpath to enable cycles to be pushed up and down the steps;
- Proposed shared cycleway/footway along the eastern side of Cuckoo Road from Lichfield Road to the entry/exit to Grand Union Canal towpath;
- Proposed shared cycleway/footway along the western side of Cuckoo Road from Long Acre to the entry/exit to Grand Union Canal towpath.

The details of the proposals are shown on the attached plan CA-02526_S01_06_04_06_007.

The Council would like to hear your views on these proposals and would be grateful if you could give us your feedback by sending your responses to transport.projects@birmingham.gov.uk or via www.birminghambeheard.org.uk. Responses should be received no later than 5th February 2016.

These are preliminary proposals and may be subject to change depending on responses received to this consultation.
