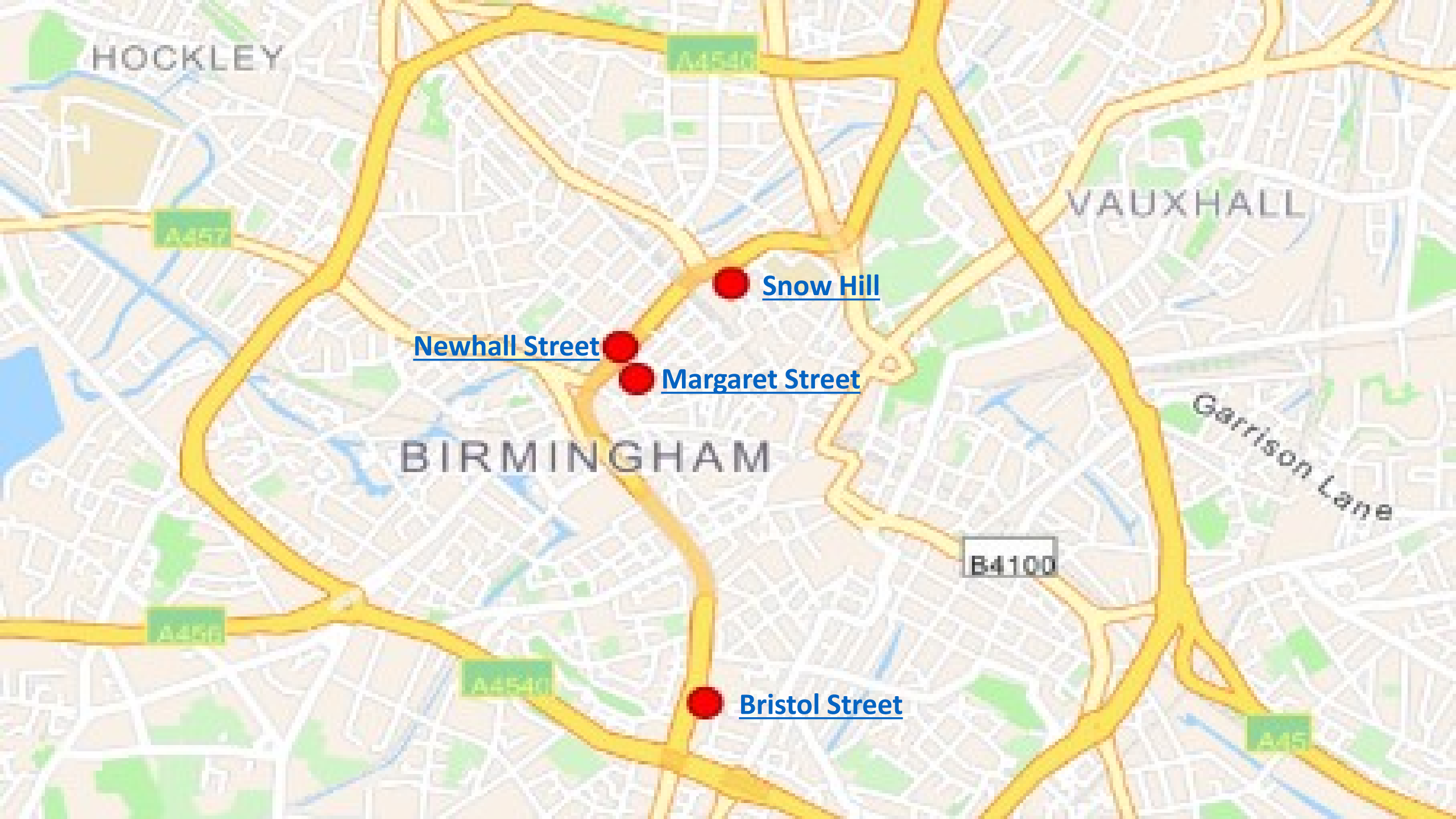

Cross City Bus Priority City Centre Works (Package 1)

The project is being funded by the West Midlands Combined Authority (WMCA) with support from the City Council and will be delivered on the WMCA's behalf by Transport for the West Midlands (TfWM).

Approval achieved to progress these projects to the initial stage of engagement for four of the interventions.

Public engagement closes on 21st March 2021



Why are we doing these projects?

Analysis of journey time savings expected from implementing a bus lane is 1.3 and 1.7 minutes per bus in the AM and PM peak respectively.

Analysis of the Real Journey Time shows 1 in 5 bus journeys over the last 7 months has experienced a delay through the same areas.

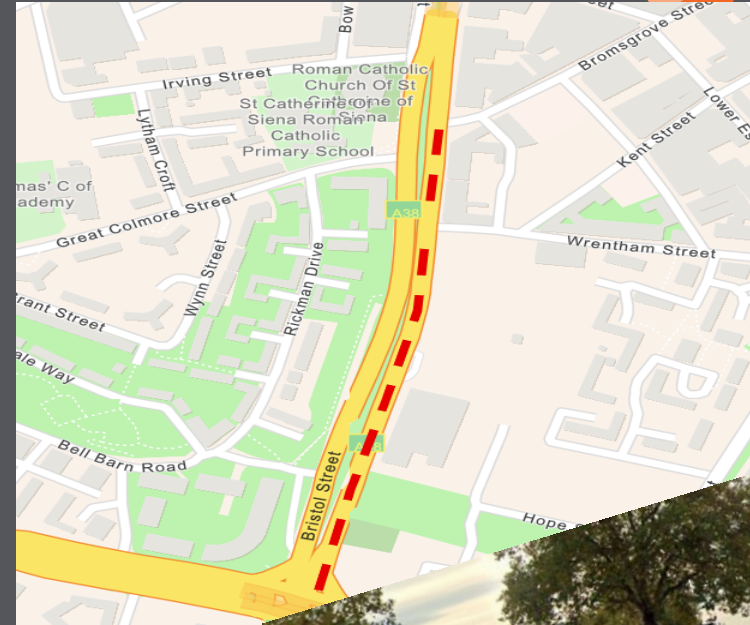
