As part of our Emergency Birmingham Transport Plan to ensure a low carbon, clean air recovery from COVID-19, we are delivering a number of temporary measures to make walking and cycling easier and safer across the city and to support social distancing.

Active travel allows people to get around whilst maintaining social distance and will have an essential role to play in helping us avoid overcrowding on public transport systems as we begin to open up parts of our economy. We have a window of opportunity to act now to embed walking and cycling as part of new long-term commuting habits and reap the associated health, air quality and congestion benefits'.

Schemes to be funded under the first tranche of the Emergency Active Travel Fund must commence delivery within four weeks of receipt of the funding by WMCA, and complete delivery within eight weeks of receipt of funding.
