CITY CENTRE TO CITY HOSPITAL CYCLE SCHEME PROPOSED EXPERIMENTALTRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER

BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL A457 DUDLEY ROAD ESTABLISHMENT OF CYCLE TRACK

NOTICE is hereby given that the above named council, in exercise of their powers under Sections 65 (1), 65 (2) and 66 of the Highways Act 1980 (as amended), and of all other enabling powers hereby propose to introduce sections of Segregated and Unsegregated Cycle Track along lengths of A457 Dudley Road.

BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL (CITY CENTRE TO CITY HOSPITAL) (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (EXPERIMENTAL) ORDER 2020

Notice is also hereby given that the above named Council has made the above named Order under Sections 9, 10(1) and 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) ("the Act") and the Bus Lane Contraventions (Approved Local Authorities) (England) Order 2005 (as amended) and of all other enabling powers the effect of which is:

- 1. To introduce a cycle lane on lengths of Hingeston Street and Graham Street
- 2. To introduce a two-way cycle lane on lengths of Northbrook Street, Clissold Street and Carver Street
- 3. To introduce no waiting at any time restrictions on lengths of Northbrook Street, Coplow Street, Clissold Street and Carver Street
- 4. To introduce no waiting between 8am and 6pm on lengths of Vittoria Street and Graham Street
- 5. To make lengths of Roseberry Street, Clissold Street, Legge Lane and Frederick Street One-way except cycles.

These Order will come into operation on 24th September 2020.

The above named Council will consider in due course whether this Experimental Order should be made permanent. Persons wishing to object to the making of the permanent Order must, within six months of the date the Order comes into operation or the date of any modification which might be made, send a statement in writing, including the grounds for their objection to the Assistant Director Transport & Connectivity, PO Box 14439, 1 Lancaster Circus Queensway, Birmingham, B2 2JE.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Experimental Order or of any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act or on the grounds that any requirements of the Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to this Order may within 6 weeks from the 10th September 2020 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
