NOTICE is hereby given that the above named Council propose to make an Order under Sections 84 (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended); the effect of which will be as follows:

To introduce and consolidate a 20 miles per hour speed limit, in the Hall Green area, including the entire lengths or sections of Alcester Road, Amesbury Road, Boundary Drive, Britannic Gardens, Britannic Park, Cadine Gardens, Conifer Court, Edgbaston Road, Elizabeth Road, Goodby Road, Harlequin Drive, Heather Dale, Holders Gardens, Holders Lane, Mapperley Gardens, Moor Green Lane, Moor Green Lane, Moorcroft Road, Queensbridge Road, Reddings Road, Russell Road, Salisbury Road, Seaton Grove, Shutlock Lane, The Russells, Tilbury Grove, Torridon Croft, Twickenham Drive, Woodnorton Drive, Yew Tree Road.
