

2022 Birmingham Commonwealth Games

What is happening?

Birmingham was selected as the host city for the 2022 Commonwealth Games in December 2017. The games are the third largest global multisport event, and an important opportunity for Birmingham to showcase the city and region on an international stage. During the games around 765,000 visitors and 4,000 media staff will visit the city.

Games Legacy

The Games will act as a catalyst for regeneration, helping deliver growth and development in line with the City's strategy for growth, set out in the Birmingham Development Plan, and providing a wide-ranging social, economic, cultural and sporting legacy for the city and region.

Perry Barr will see significant investment including the delivery of the scheme which is the subject of this application, as well as wider housing growth, improvements to local infrastructure and transport provision, and the redevelopment of Alexander Stadium.



Athletes' Village

As a host city, Birmingham is required to provide an Athletes' Village to provide accommodation for around 6,500 athletes and officials who will visit Birmingham during the games.

In addition to the 'accommodation' being delivered as part of this planning application, a range of temporary facilities will also need to be provided including a dining hall, transport mall, office, medical, recreation space and security provisions.

These temporary uses will then be removed following completion of the games.
