## SMALL HEATH – 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT PROPOSED TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER

## BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL (SMALL HEATH, NECHELLS) (20MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 201\*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above named Council propose to make an Order under Sections 84 (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended); the effect of which will be:

To introduce and consolidate a 20 miles per hour speed limit, in the Small Heath area, including the entire lengths or sections of Amiss Gardens, Arsenal Street, Arthur Street, Barnford Close, Bassett Croft, Bolton Road, Camelot Way, Cattell Road, Chapman Road, Cooksey Road, Coventry Road, Cyril Road, Danford Gardens, Darnel Croft, Dixon Road, East Farm Croft, Eversley Road, Gisborn Close, Glovers Road, Great Wood Road, Greenway Street, Hafton Grove, Henshaw Road, Herbert Road, Holmwood Road, Jenkins Street, Keats Avenue, Langley Road, Little Green Lane, Millward Street, Minster Drive, Monkswell Close, Mount Pleasant, Muntz Street, North Warwick Street, Oakley Road, Parliament Street, Prince Albert Street, Railway View, Regent Park Road, Sandfields Avenue, Storrs Close, Storrs Place, Talfourd Street, Taywood Drive, Vann Close, Watts Road, Whitmore Road, Wright Street and Wyndcliff Road.
