Alteration description

4. A description of the proposed alteration and in the case of special school proposals, a description of the current special needs provision.

The proposed changes are as follows:

1. Increase in the number of pupils 155 to 204

2. Two additional sites have been identified for the expansion of the school at; Site One: Chamberlain House, Yew Tree Road, Birmingham B13 8QB Site Two: 40 Russell Road, Moseley, Birmingham B13 8RE

Uffculme School educates pupils of 2 - 19 years. The school educates children with a statement or education health plan for Autistic Spectrum Conditions.

It is proposed that the site at Russell Road will be for the Post-16 provision.

School capacity

Uffculme School currently has 153 pupils on roll, can offer up to 155 places, and plans to offer 204 places by 1st September 2016.

Site 2 : Russell Road, Moseley, Birmingham B13 8RE is for P-16 provision (and is 1.02km from Queensbridge Road

The proposal is expand the school by adding two additional sites.

Site 1: Chamberlain House, Yew Tree Road, Moseley, Birmingham B13 8QG (0.5km from Queensbridge Road) this site is for the expansion of the school up to year 11.

Site 2 : Russell Road, Moseley, Birmingham B13 8RE is for the post 16 provision (and is 1.02km from Queensbridge Road)

Site 1: Chamberlain House, Yew Tree Road, Moseley, Birmingham B13 8QG is 0.5km from Queensbridge Road Moseley site.

Site 2: Russell Road, Moseley, Birmingham B13 8RE is 1.02km from Queensbridge Road.

The Uffculme site on Queensbridge Road is not suitable for a building expansion. It has been necessary to accommodate pupils in temporary accommodation whilst we have tried to identify a suitable alternative site. Chamberlain House, Yew Tree Road and 40 Russell Road Moseley have now been identified as two sites to enable us to expand Uffculme School permanently.

These changes are considered appropriate for the current pupils at the school in order to provide an improved accommodation solution and better meet the needs of its pupils, and is part of a programme to enhance the overall school accommodation solution for its current and future pupils.

(d) the accessibility of the proposed site or sites;

The site complies with the requirements of the Equality Act 2010 and is fully accessible.

(e) the proposed arrangements for transport of pupils to the school on its new site; and

Education Transport will be fully engaged and advised of the proposed changes. They will continue to provide the home school transport level of provision that the children need to ensure that they can attend all three sites. The Local Authority's transport arrangements will apply where applicable.

(f) a statement about other sustainable transport alternatives where pupils are not using transport provided, and how car use in the school area will be discouraged.

The School Travel Plan will be updated following the implementation of the changes to promote sustainable transport and reduce car use where possible. This is currently in the process of being updated with the Local Authority in readiness.

Objectives

10. The objectives of the proposals.

Birmingham City Council is proposing the above prescribed changes, in line with the Special Schools Additional Places Programme. The changes are considered appropriate for the current pupils at the school in order to provide an improved accommodation solution and better meet the needs of its pupils.

In September 2009 Uffculme School went through school organisation changes to raise their upper age limit to 19 to include a provision for secondary aged pupils with Autistic

Spectrum Disorder. It was proposed that they would increase year on year from year 7 onwards.

The Queensbridge site was unsuitable for a permanent expansion and it was agreed that the pupils would be accommodated in portacabin-type accommodation until suitable accommodation for expansion was identified.

Chamberlain House was identified as a suitable site for the expansion. Full Business Case agreed by Cabinet in Jan 2014. Due to delays purchasing Chamberlain House the pupils have been accommodated in portacabin-type accommodation on Queensbridge Road and more recently on Chamberlain Road site.

Russell Road Moseley has also been purchased for the accommodation of 30 Post-16 pupils.

The expansion of the school onto three sites will enable a greater number of pupils to access the successful provision. The school was given an outstanding ranking on their last 2 OFSTED inspections. In 2014 the achievement of pupils, quality of teaching, Behaviour and Safety of Pupils and Leadership and management was all found to be outstanding.

It will enable the Council to meet its statutory duty to not only provide pupil places but also promote diversity and increase parental choice in planning and securing the provision of school places.

The proposed changes will offer professional development and improve retention and recruitment of the school's high quality teaching and non-teaching staff.

Due regard and careful consideration was given to the guidance contained within 'School Organisation - Maintained Schools, Guidance for Proposers and Decision-Makers' document, Jan 2014. All individuals or bodies suggested in the guidance are being consulted and their views considered.

A copy of the proposal document was sent out to the school week commencing 7th September for distribution to parents/carers of all children registered at the school. This document can be found on <u>www.birmingham.gov.uk/schools/uffculme</u> Officers offered the school the opportunity for parents meetings during the representation period. An email has been sent to all relevant Local Councillors, MP, neighbouring authorities, the Diocesan (Both Anglican and Roman Catholic) and trade unions with information on how to obtain consultation packs. An online response BeHeard survey is in place for consultees to respond during the representation period.

Project costs

- Purchase and refurbishment of Russell Road Site, Moseley Road £900,000.00 purchase and £1,223,392.00 from Demographic Growth Capital fund.

The changes are considered appropriate for the current pupils at the school in order to provide an improved accommodation solution and better meet the needs of its pupils. The addition of the two extra sites is part of a programme to enhance the overall school accommodation solution for its current and future pupils. The Uffculme site is not suitable for expansion. The Chamberlain site on Highbury Road was identified as a suitable alternative accommodation - subject to refurbishment- which would allow Uffculme School to transfer some of its pupils and have enough capacity to allow Uffculme School to increase its pupil numbers to 204.

The addition of the Russell Road Building will help support up to 30 students with high and complex Autistic Spectrum Continuum needs, aged 16 -19 to become confident, responsible and participative citizens and employees in their local and wider community. The new centre will help to provide opportunities to broaden and deepen existing knowledge and experiences. The provision is sited strategically close to all supporting agencies and amenities allowing young people with high and complex needs to fulfil their potential through the development of many skills thus allowing them to take their place in our local communities.

The proposal will help to create additional special school places in line with demand so more pupils going forwards have access to suitable places.

The headlines are as follows:

- Birmingham City Council as the local authority for Birmingham has a statutory duty to provide sufficient school places.
- The city of Birmingham has a growing population with one of the youngest populations in Europe and the number of births in the city has risen rapidly over the last few years.
- To compound this Birmingham is also experiencing high levels of in year growth due to net migration into the city.
- On the basis of current demand for special school places, without factoring in trends in complex needs, our model indicates the need for an additional 554 places from 2012–20 based purely on growth and assuming that the proportion of young people with complex needs remains constant and the proportion of those young people educated in special schools remains constant.

Post 16 - In April 2013 Education & Skills Infrastructure circulated an E brief to all Birmingham institutions eligible to apply for DGCF (i.e. Schools, Further education Colleges and young Peoples Learning Agency's Independent Providers.) This briefing identified the key gaps in provision identified for Post-16 gap analysis. Applications meeting BCC priorities were invited from providers identified as eligible by the Education Funding Agency (EFA.) All applicants were subject to internal review by a panel consisting of representatives from Finance, Planning, SENAR & EdSI. Uffculme School bid was approved.
