Summary of years 1 and 2 (2019-2021)

Prevention and Communities grants

- Citizens supported- approximately 55,000
- Income maximisation/debt recovery – approximately £4.8mln

Information advice and guidance

- Citizens supported- approximately 4,800



Covid – impact on delivery

Flexibility, creative and innovative ideas to offer continued support and reduce social isolation

e.g.:

- buddy schemes, telephone helplines, WhatsApp groups
- activity/craft boxes - gardening equipment, online initiatives, arts – drawing, knitting, goody bags
- shopping, food parcels, hot meals, healthy eating
- socially distanced walks and outdoor exercise

Digital Inclusion:

- supporting access, engagement, barriers for the most isolated citizens to engage in activities

Journey of the P&C Programme

- Old Third Sector Grants (TSG) programme closed Sept 2019. New P&C Programme commenced in October 2019
- 2 restricted sub groups for historical grantees from the TSG programme
 - Community and Day Opportunities
 - Prevention and Early Intervention
- 2 subgroups open to all applicants
 - New and Emerging
 - Community Inclusion
- Development of 3 IAG contracts (new and emerging conditions) within the wider programme
 - Physical disability
 - Visual loss or impairment
 - Hearing loss or impairment



Information, Advice and Guidance Contracts

- To be included as part of this recommissioning (seeking extension from Jan 23- Sept 23 to align with the Prevention and Communities Grants programme)
- Review priorities- disability, visual impairment, hearing impairment
- Ensure the learning from the IAG contracts is reflected in the development of the IAG Strategic Framework



Moving forward

- New P&C Programme to commence on 1st October 2023
- Review of existing providers and co-design events with key stakeholders
- Ensure links to the whole life course approach and the new re-designed NNS service which includes – Younger Adults with long-term disabilities

- Adult Social Care e.g. Social Work teams, Commissioners
