

# Birmingham City Council School Organisation Proposals

## Notice of Proposed Change to the Age Range of Thornton Primary School

Notice is given in accordance with Section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Birmingham City Council ('the Council') is proposing to make a prescribed alteration to Thornton Primary School, Thornton Road, Ward End, Birmingham B8 2LQ ('the School'), a community primary school, namely to change the lower age range at the School from 4 years to 7 years.

The School currently has a lower age limit of 4 years. The Published Admission Number (PAN) is for 30 pupils in each year from Reception to Year 2 (Key Stage 1, KS1), and a PAN of 150 pupils in each year from Years 3 to 6 (Key Stage 2, KS2). If this prescribed change is approved, KS1 provision at the School would be phased out and the School's lower age limit will be 7 years by 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019. If the proposal is approved, the Schools Adjudicator has given permission to reduce the PAN for Reception in September 2017 to zero and this will mean no pupils will be admitted in Reception for this year. However, the school will continue to admit pupils into Year 3. The proposal is also for the Year 3 PAN to be reduced to 120 pupils from 1 September 2020 onwards as the current KS1 pupils will have entered KS2.

If the proposal is not approved, the Local Authority can increase PAN without further referral to the Schools Adjudicator.

The School's admissions criteria for entry to Year 3 currently state that pupils who attend Sladefield Infant School have priority when places in Year 3 at the School are allocated. The Council proposes that this admission criterion would stay the same.

The Council will then take all views into consideration and make a determination regarding the proposal by 1<sup>st</sup> February 2017. If the Council does not make a determination on or before that date the Schools Adjudicator will determine whether the proposal shall take effect.
